



Aurora Capacity Development Training Event#3: Social Entrepreneurship 28 March, 2025

South-West University "Neofit Rilski", Blagoevgrad, Bulgaria

On behalf of the AURORA alliance, we are pleased to welcome you to the third training event of the Capacity Development Programme (CDP) under the ongoing Aurora Alliance 2030 programme. This event is organised by the Aurora CDP Task Team at Palacky University (UP) and Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam (VU), in close collaboration with South-West University "Neofit Rilski" (SWUNR), and will be hosted in Blagoevgrad, Bulgaria.

The hybrid one-day event on 28th March, titled "Social Entrepreneurship as a Way Forward in Increasing Academic Activities through Sustainable Business Models," includes an introductory session on the Aurora Social Entrepreneurship and Innovation Scales for Measuring Impact Competences, a training workshop dedicated to teaching social entrepreneurship, and a panel discussing the best policies and practices from the Aurora universities. Additionally, the programme will feature an inspirational session on leadership and the role of spirituality in entrepreneurship, highlighting social relations and the positive effects on businesses and local communities. During the training segment of the workshop, we will examine the social entrepreneurship ecosystem and practical lessons learned to identify potential sustainable business models that involve diverse learners as stakeholders.

This event aims to unlock the potential of academic activities in training professionals who can develop sustainable business models. It explores the concept of "collective effort towards sustainability" within educational institutions by examining the role of education and the commitments that businesses and entrepreneurs should uphold.

After completing the training, participants will be equipped to navigate the future with an understanding of successful sustainable business models. Furthermore, they will utilise best practices from Aurora universities and possess the skills necessary to design new policies and practices that support the development of educational approaches for social entrepreneurship.

This event is part of a series of capacity-building sessions organised within the Aurora 2030 Capacity Development Programme framework. The programme aims to enhance the capacity for academic excellence and societal relevance of the Aurora associate partner universities and support them in establishing regional hubs for sharing best practices from Aurora.





The event will be conducted in English and is open to members of the university management, teachers, students, and staff of South-West University "Neofit Rilski," as well as those from the Aurora associate partner universities in CEE and the members of their Aurora regional hubs. The training approach's target audience includes students, academic and administrative staff (workshop), university management (panel discussion), local entrepreneurs, and representatives from local authorities and NGOs in the region.

Trainers and speakers' BIOs

Selma Porobić



Selma Porobić holds a PhD in migration studies from Lund University in Sweden and various academic qualifications from the American University in Cairo, Fordham University in New York, and Oxford University in the UK. She is an internationally recognised scholar who has published on a range of topics related to educational themes concerning global inequalities, human rights, justice, and peacebuilding. Furthermore, she chairs the 'Non-EU Partnerships' ForEU 2 working group, which unites 28 European university alliances.

Oleksandr Khyzhniak

Dr. Oleksandr Khyzhniak has broad experience in international collaboration, management project education, and research. He prefers to use interdisciplinary approaches and is open to international relations that grounds on his two MA degrees in Sociology and International Economics at Karazin University (Ukraine). During his academic research career, he did his internships in 2009 at Warszawa University (Poland) for the PhD devoted to tolerance issues and at Ariel University (Israel) in 2016-2017 for the post-doc project devoted to collective actions and its determination. During his work experience, he combined educational, research, and management activities. In 2010 he started lecturing at Karazin university. Managers, leadership, and intercultural skills he could fully implement became the Head of the newly emerged and co-designed International Relations Office at Karazin University (2018-2022) that focused on providing international mobility, projects (grants) implementation, and establishing international relations.

Kai Hockerts is a Professor in Social Entrepreneurship at Copenhagen Business School (CBS). In his function as Academic Coordinator, he leads the CBS Aurora Alliance team which aims to develop international and interdisciplinary social entrepreneurship education content across ten European universities. Kai's primary research focus is on corporate sustainability strategies, social entrepreneurship, and impact investing. Kai holds a Ph.D. in Management from the University of St. Gallen (CH). Before joining CBS Kai was Adjunct Professor at INSEAD (F). His research has been published in outlets such as the Journal of Business Venturing, Entrepreneurship Theory and Practice, Academy of Management Education and Learning, Journal of Business Ethics, California Management Review, International Journal of Entrepreneurial Behavior & Research,

International Journal of Entrepreneurial Venturing, Journal of Small Business & Entrepreneurship, Journal of Social Entrepreneurship, Social Enterprise Journal and Business Strategy and the Environment. Furthermore, Kai is a section editor at the Journal of Business Ethics, and an editorial board member at the Journal of Business Venturing, Entrepreneurship Theory & Practice, Social Enterprise Journal, and Business Strategy and the Environment.

Ondřej Kročil



Ondřej Kročil has been working at Palacký University, Department of Economic and Management Studies, since 2017. He specializes in social entrepreneurship, which he dealt with in his PhD thesis defended in 2019. 




Mariya Stankova
